With Germany defeated, the U.S. and its allies is planning to defeat Japan no later than 1946. Many citizens want to bring the troops home as quickly as possible. Americans have been at war for more than three years and war weariness has set in. There are fears, however, that a flood of returning soldiers looking for work and the scaling back of wartime industry will lead to a serious recession or depression.
